#1 Stanford Develops ChatEHR

What Happened:

Stanford pilots an AI chatbot that lets providers "chat" with a patient's EHR.

Why It Matters:

The homegrown AI tool could potentially save clinicians from spending time on gathering patient information from within the EHR, freeing them up for more top-of-license activities.

Omada Health's IPO raises \$150 million, earning a \$1 billion valuation.

What Happened:

Madison Dearborn becomes an owner of NextGen, which will replace its CEO.

Why It Matters:

Madison Dearborn will share management of the company with Thoma Bravo, which took NextGen private in 2023.

#5 Mayo Clinic to Invest in Hellocare.ai

What Happened:

Mayo Clinic will invest in and partner with Hellocare.ai.

Why It Matters:

The companies will focus on developing ambient clinical Al.
