# #1 OpenEvidence Raises More Money

OpenEvidence raises \$200 million in Series C funding.

Brook.ai raises \$28 million in Series B funding.

## Why It Matters:

The remote care company will use the investment to further scale its offerings and expand its product and engineering headcount.

# #5 Verily Launches Consumer Health App

## What Happened:

Verily launches the free Verily Me consumer health app.

## Why It Matters:

Alphabet-owned Verily will offer the app, which features an AI companion and the ability to opt in to research studies, to consumers, employers, payers, and pharmacy benefit managers.
