#1 Misuse of AI Chatbots Deemed Tech Hazard

What Happened:

ECRI puts “misuse of AI chatbots” at the top of its tech hazards list for 2026.

Why It Matters:

Rapid Care will add DeepDoc's AI-powered medical record insights and summaries solutions to its clinical documentation, records review, and revenue cycle management services.

#5 Harmony Healthcare IT Acquires Blue Elm

What Happened:

Harmony Healthcare IT acquires Meditech solutions provider Blue Elm.

Why It Matters:

The acquisition strengthens Harmony Healthcare IT's Meditech-specific health data management and archiving solutions.
