#1 Hackers Hit Stryker

What Happened:

Hackers linked to Iran attack medical device maker Stryker.

Why It Matters:

Experts warn that the attack, which impacted 200,000 company servers and devices, could serve as a test case for future attacks on large US corporations.

#2 Epic's Legal Tussles Escalate

What Happened:

Epic secures GuardDog's agreement to a lawsuit judgment and injunction.

Why It Matters:

GuardDog Telehealth's acknowledgment that it sold patient medical records to law firms strengthens Epic's claim in its separate suit against Health Gorilla.

#3 Nitra Raises \$50 Million

What Happened:

Nitra raises \$50 million in Series B funding.

Why It Matters:

The medical practice AI agent vendor will use the funding to launch additional AI models and hire an additional 150 employees by the end of this year.

#4 Turquoise Health Announces Series C

What Happened:

Turquoise Health raises a \$40 million Series C funding round.

Why It Matters:

Healthcare pricing and payment platform vendor Turquoise Health, which has raised \$95 million since launching five years ago, will use this latest investment to expand its headcount and go-to-market efforts.

#5 Microsoft Introduces Copilot Health

What Happened:

Microsoft launches Copilot Health to collect, summarize medical records.

Why It Matters:

The new Copilot application, which appears to be a revamp of Copilot for Health, leverages data capabilities from HealthEx that tap into TEFCA, CareQuality, and CommonWell.
